## **News from Floyd:**

The U.S. Supreme Court struck down a decision by a lower court that essentially would have banned the hunting videos we see on TV all the time. The bunny huggers tried to ban the videos in the name of animal cruelty claiming they were something on the order of "snuff" videos.

Two bills have been introduced in congress that seek to return Second Amendment rights to the citizens of Washington D.C. Ever since the Heller decision the Mayor, Chief of Police and City Council have been using every tactic they can think of to get around the return of the rights of the residents of the nations capitol. S. 3265 sponsored by Sen. John McCain, (R-AZ) and John Tester, (D-MT) and H.R. 5162 sponsored by Reps. Travis Childers, (D-MS) and Mark Souder (R-IND) were introduced the week of April 27 and are directed at the continuing attacks being formulated against the gun rights of the cities citizens. A voting rights bill has been pulled from the house floor by the D.C.'s Congressional representative Eleanor Holmes Norton, an avowed anti-gun politician, because it contained language that would have returned the gun rights to that cities populace. The bill also would have given the representative a vote in congress but she would forgo representing her constituency in favor of suppressing their other rights.

In his continuing opposition to the rights of the citizens of Chicago Mayor Richard Daley is now attempting to bring his case for gun control before the World Court. Apparently fearing his cities gun ban will be overturned by the U.S. Supreme Court Daley has resorted to this radical, extremist tactic to keep the cities population under the thumb of political gun bans and defenseless against the cities crooks, murderers, gangsters and hoodlums.

Bloomberg is again trying to capitalize on an event completely unrelated to legislation currently in the U.S. Congress. The Times Square bomber in New York used 5 gallon cans of gasoline, propane tanks, and some fireworks to assemble an explosive device very amateurishly according to Police Commissioner Ray Kelly. Both he and Hizzoner testified before a congressional hearing that Lautenberg's pending legislation would bar people merely suspected of terrorist activity from purchasing firearms or explosives and would have prevented the attempted attack. The Mayor and Commish do not explain how banning gun and explosive sales are in any way related to your barbecue propane tanks or spare gas cans on the back of your Jeep.

Also introduced into the congress are three new bills attacking our Second Amendment freedom. H.R. 2159 by Rep Peter King of N.Y. and S. 1317 by Lautenberg that would again ban those being merely *suspected* of terrorist activity or on a terrorist watch list would be prohibited from acquiring firearms or explosives. Lautenberg's other bill, S.2820 would also mandate background check approvals be maintained for 180 days extending the 24 hour period now in effect. An additional provision of the legislation allows a person being

added to a watch list to appeal his/her listing but they would not be able to observe the evidence against them and would only be provided with summaries or edited versions of the information, due process apparently is out the window with these bills.

The surplus military cartridge brass situation seems to be taking a different turn every time we turn around. ATK is a contractor that scraps fired military brass under a contract with the DLA (Defense Logistics Agency) thus removing it from civilian channels where the brass is used by companies to remanufacture small arms ammunition. ATK has withdrawn from the contract upon request of Senators Max Baucus and John Testor the issue being that government funds cannot be used to demil (destroy) the brass cases in language contained in a defense appropriations bill passed in the past. Additionally Rep Brad Ellsworth, D-In, introduced an amendment to H.R. 5136 the defense appropriations bill that will insure once fired military brass will not be scrapped and will be made available for commercial use. Apparently we now will have a continuing supply of military brass for civilian use.

There is an internet "Alert" circulating about that Hillary has signed a treaty on international gun control. These are false. The Secretary of State has no authority to sign treaties. (From NRA-ILA)

The Oregon legislature sent a request to the Oregon State Police requesting their opinion of what fee increases might be necessary in the years 2011-2013 to support some Core Service programs such as fingerprinting, CHL background checks and the fee charged when buying a gun. The OSP responded with the following: the fee for the background check when buying a firearm was changed from \$10 to \$28, Fingerprinting fee from \$20 to \$28 and CHL fee from \$15 to \$30. The legislature will use these estimates to evaluate the present fee structure and whether the current fees support the programs. The fee structure has not yet been put into effect it is only an estimate for evaluation purposes.

At our last JSSA meeting I furnished the Email addresses of two contact persons to protest the fee increases and this seems a bit premature as the legislature appears to be the body to set the fee structure. As long as they are not in session there appears to be no cause for concern at present. If the situation changes I will inform the membership so we may act accordingly.
