## **News from Floyd:**

Statistics are normally major boring however I thought these were very interesting: Since Britain banned handguns in 1997 they have experienced a 77% increase in violent crimes. They have a rate of 2,034 violent crimes per 100k population, South Africa's rate is 1,609 and Canada follows with 935. The U.S., with all those nasty handguns brings up the rear with 466. The U.S. Supreme Court refused to hear an appeal from a lower court case that sought to hold gun manufacturers and dealers accountable for the actions of persons that used their products to commit crimes. The case was the basis of the Lawful Commerce in Arms Act that shields the gun industry from frivolous litigation while allowing those with legitimate grounds for legal action to recover damages suffered with a genuine faulty product.

Last January the U.S. Supreme court voided the Shays-Meehan Campaign Finance reform law saying it was unconstitutional by blocking free speech during election campaigns. In recent weeks some members of the House of Representatives have introduced a bill seeking to reinstate those restrictions and add others in the form of H.R.5175. The NRA opposed this legislation. The Democratic leadership in the House sought to gain NRA support by exempting them from the bill's provisions. The media is accusing the NRA of deal cutting when in fact the media did not understand the position of the NRA and went on a toot claiming all sorts of shady political deals. The Democrats dug themselves a hole and were trying to use the NRA as a foil to get them out. Further amendments were offered in order to get the NRA on board, they refused and Feinstein said she would oppose any amendments that benefited the NRA. Those that flipped out and jumped on the "bash NRA band wagon" should go to the NRA-ILA website and read their position before forming an opinion that might make them look somewhat foolish.

The OSP is getting more serious about fee increases for CHL's, gun purchase background checks and charges for fingerprinting. They are apparently holding hearings in Malheur and Umatilla counties. It might be a good time to let Senator Doug Whitsett and Rep Bill Garrard know that we oppose such increases.

According to the National Review Supreme Court nominee Elena Kagan who once wrote a memo that contributed to an executive order for Bill Clinton that would ban semi-automatic firearms once compared the NRA with the KKK. Some outlandish comparisons crop up in politics occasionally and this one compares the oldest civil rights organization in the U.S with the racial hatred based KKK. Only dipstick Michael Moore in "Bowling for Columbine" sank to such depths of ignorant, hateful associations in NRA bashing.

Jackson County Sheriff Mike Winters has lost a lawsuit that keeps persons with CHL's name private. An Oregon appeals court ruled that the names are public record and must be released to the Medford Mail Tribune for the years 2006-2007. The years specified are connected to a lawsuit by Medford teacher Shirley Katz who sued the school district so she could carry a defensive handgun because she feared for her life. In the decision the court said that the Sheriff must be able to prove each licensee had a compelling reason of personal security in order to keep the records confidential. Our

Senator Doug Whitsett has stated he will see to it that a bill addressing this issue will be written and in such a way that the opposition cannot doctor it for their own purposes.

When I renewed my CHL a couple weeks ago there was a question on the application that asked “Is this license for your own personal security”? This question apparently satisfies the state requirement of proof for personal security reasons.

The U.S. Supreme Court has voided the City of Chicago’s gun ban with a predictable 5-4 majority decision on June 28<sup>th</sup>. Daley and company will most likely resort to D.C. style tactics to essentially keep the ban in place with ballistics fingerprinting, safe storage, registration, non existent microstamping and whatever else they can conjure up to block rights.

## JSSA news:

Within the past year we have started publishing our match scores to provide those competitors and other interested parties with information that is of interest to them. This has been beneficial to the club in that it provides advertisement of our shooting sports activities to the membership and outsiders that may wish to participate.

At the June meeting it was decided that those organizations that wish to conduct raffles at our bi-annual gun shows must apply in writing. The purpose of the JSSA, NRA and Sportsman’s park raffles is to generate funds that benefit the park. These other organizations activities do not benefit the park and we are going to limit them starting with the December show.

The two year trial period for the Sports Show has expired and it now will be a permanent addition to our spring show.

Secretary Larry Green has compiled a list of those members that have failed to renew their membership for 2010 with some very active, familiar names on it. Appropriate actions are being studied to bring those in arrears up to date.

The raffle at the monthly meeting was won by John Schreiner who selected a box of Speer bullets from the assorted loot.

The self-service trap has been deactivated due to lack of participation.

Preston’s IDPA match for August will be different to say the least. The following is a general description furnished by match director P. Shaw: First Preston wishes to thank John S. and Dan G. who always show up very early to help set-up the matches. To everyone who helps after the matches you are really appreciated too.

The August match is going to be quite a bit unusual; each shooter will shoot all four stages consecutively as fast as magazines can be reloaded and stages scored and reset. There will be shooting on in all four bays at one time. This will be an intense 10-15 minutes for the shooter. At stage one you become involved in a convenience store robbery when no matter how much you kick, punch, stab, and shoot you will be kidnapped.

At stage 2 you will have been taken to a remote location where the gang can torture and kill you. You will escape using various weapons including your own handgun.

At stage 3 while at the police station, you will stop a jail break but not with your own handgun.

At stage 4 arriving home you find the neighborhood gang trying to steal your gun safe.
