News from Floyd:

Representative Carolyn McCarthy (D) Ny has introduced a bill in the House of representatives almost identical to Schumer's that calls for further restrictions on law abiding citizens and ignoring enforcement of existing law. Called The Fix Gun Checks Act of 2011 McCarthy's legislation will withhold federal crime prevention funding from those states that do not comply with the bill's mandate that establishes mental evaluation teams at universities and colleges that are supposed to uncover the Jerald Loughner's and Fort Hood shooters mentally deranged state. Also included are provisions to eliminate private sales at gun shows as provided for in the GCA '68 language. The legislation requires all firearms sales to be conducted through a licensed FFL dealer thus effecting national registration of all firearms transfers a long time goal of the gun control organizations.

McCarthy has stopped short of Schumers provision that would prohibit sales of firearms to persons that have been arrested and not convicted of a prohibitive crime but includes a ban on hi-capacity magazines.

Rep. Bob Gibbs (R) OH has introduced H.R. 1865 the Recreational lands Self Defense Act that would provide law abiding CHL holders to be able to legally carry their licensed concealed handgun on Army Corps of Engineers lands

The NRA and CRPA are filing suit against the city of Los Angeles Police Department for not obeying a court order mandating

that they provide CCW applications and denial appeal forms to applicants who request them. Following the decisions in 1992 and 1994 the LAPD has refused to process any application in the city.

In another lawsuit the NRA, IRPA and plaintiff Mary Shepard are suing the state of Illinois to hopefully abolish the state's ban on concealed carry.

Outgoing Chicago Mayor Richard Daley Has requested a 3 man 24hr security detail when he leaves office in May. Daley has also asked the city to furnish a car for himself and one for his wife too.

Senator Doug Whitsett reports that 3 bills in the Oregon legislature are presently in the Senate Judiciary committee awaiting action. House Bills 2787-A CHL confidentially, 2792-A CHL reciprocity and 2797-A that defines what is a "readily accessible firearm" with respect to an ATV or snowmobile have passed the house but their fate is uncertain in the Senate. HB 2787-A is identical to S-582 authored by Senator Whitsett that was killed in the Senate committee by unsupportable amendments. It is feared that "poison pill" amendments will also kill these remaining bi-partisan bills.

California gun owners are under attack from anti-gun legislators seeking to destroy their constitutional right to arms. Bills in the legislature are seeking to reclassify all ammunition as "armor piercing", redefine handgun ammunition to include all rifle ammunition and require registration of all ammunition. Another bill would mandate that ammunition sellers (Cont'd on pg 2)

obtain a license from local authorities before beginning business.

An attack on air guns is also in the mill and a bill that would require all air and BB guns be painted white, bright red, bright orange, bright green or other color as the predominant color of the gun. Also there is a bill require registration of all new rifles and shotguns
