News from Floyd:

The Blair Holt Gun Registration and Licensing bill, HR 45 has lain dormant now for a year with no sign of any action to move it, this is as it should be even it spite of the numerous shootings recently. Front pages as of late have blared headlines of murders by college professors, psychiatrists, police officers, disgruntled employees, social security recipients, upset spouses and just about any other category of person you can name and this in spite of the Brady Bunch and their phony crime prevention programs. There is no way to prevent or predict when something goes click and someone goes on a rampage, there is no way.

Arizonans are benefiting from the appointment of former anti-gun governor Janet Napolitano to the Obama cabinet by advancing pro-gun bills through the legislature. Among bills being considered is one that would align Arizona with Vermont and Alaska by allowing law abiding citizens to carry a concealed, defensive firearm without a formal license. Some states use the CHL process to severely restrict or deny licenses and also use the license process as a revenue generating vehicle. Another bill would follow Montana and other states in declaring firearms manufactured, sold and remaining in the state to be exempt from federal regulations. A third proposed law would permit college professors to carry concealed on campus. NRA-ILA

News from other states: Virginia is processing a bill that would abolish their one gun a month rationing system. The Georgia legislature is about to pass a law that permits those dropping airline passengers off at their Hartsfield airport to be allowed to possess a concealed handgun in their vehicle providing they have a concealed carry permit. The state of Wyoming is a step closer to a no license concealed carry law with the passage of the bill out of a legislative committee. NRA-ILA.

Another courageous Sheriff has defied an academic, liberal establishment by refusing to support the Colorado State University's new ban on concealed weapons on CSU campuses. Larimer County Sheriff James Alderdeen stated in a newspaper interview that he "would undermine the new ban in the interest of student safety". The Sheriff also stated: If anyone with one of my permits gets arrested for concealed carry at CSU, I will refuse to book that person into my jail. Furthermore, I will show up at court and testify on that person's behalf, and I will do whatever I can to discourage a conviction. I will not be a party to this very poor decision."
