## **News from Floyd:**

A Clinton appointed federal judge has dismissed the Heller II lawsuit against Washington DC's bans on hi-cap magazines, "assault weapons" and semi-auto pistols that are capable of holding more than ten rounds, their registration scheme and ballistic testing. Citing the original Heller decision Judge Urbina stated that Heller did not establish that the second amendment is a fundamental right. In his opinion he said that unless the law provides a compelling government interest it is invalid. The decision is being appealed.

A lackey for the Brady Bunch is now proposing to register all long guns in California. Gun hating Assemblyman Mike Feuer is proposing to register all long guns in the state by playing bait and switch with AB 1810. The bill originally addressed graffiti and vandalism but was rewritten to require the failed Canadian style registration scheme. Ingoing the monumental failure of the Canadian system Feuer has no qualms about spending the people's money on a multi-billion dollar farce that is being rightly rejected by the people of our northern neighbor. The Democratic lawmaker also authored the micro-stamping law Swartzenegger signed despite the fact such technology does not exist.

Arizona Governor Jan Brewer has signed a bill into law that allows Arizonans to carry a concealed handgun without a government issued license and all the accompanying hoops licenses require. Arizona is now the third state behind Vermont and Alaska to recognize the right to bear arms without requiring government permission.

Bloomberg is starting a campaign again against gun shows. His latest load of dung is to register gun show promoters and give the Attorney General unlimited powers to impose fees and regulations on the promoters. Under the bill anyone that sells a gun at a gun show would be entered into a federal database permanently. Also the bill would require the promoter to maintain a record of that sale then allow the feds to collect those records. This article is too lengthy to print in its entirety but is a concentrated attack on gun rights and gun shows in particular. Go to NRA-ILA for the complete article in all its unconstitutional glory.
